Participation will be limited to those who:

- Live or work in Bell Gardens
- At least 18 years of age
- Have no felony convictions
- No misdemeanor arrests in the past 12 months
- Have no current outstanding warrants

The Program

The Bell Gardens Police Department will be conducting a six (6) week Community Academy designed to give citizens an overview of our Department's policies and procedures. The classes will be taught by police officers, supervisors and civilian police personnel. Some of the topics include: History of Law Enforcement and of the Bell Gardens Police Department, Patrol Functions and Criminal Law, Records, Dispatch, Neighborhood Watch, Investigations and Use of Force, including scenario training.
