Recommendation: It is staff's recommendation that the Traffic and Safety Commission: 1. authorize staff to distribute a Speed Hump Survey Questionnaire to all residents fronting Ira Avenue from Clara Street to Gotham Street, requesting their confirmation of support or opposition of the proposed speed hump installation; and 2. if at least 51% resident support is obtained, approve for City Council consideration the installation of two (2) proposed speed humps on Ira Avenue as shown in Exhibit 2; or 3. if less than 51% resident support is obtained, deny and close out the citizen speed hump request.

MINUTES OF THE CITY OF BELL GARDENS TRAFFIC AND SAFETY COMMISSION MEETING

October 3, 2023

CALL TO ORDER: Chairperson Heredia called the Traffic & Safety Commission

Meeting to order at 5:34 pm.

ROLL CALL: Ms. Sanchez took roll call.

PRESENT: Commissioner Alvarado attended the meeting via

teleconference under "just cause." Commissioner Barrera, Commissioner Gavilanes and Chair Heredia were present. Bernardo Iniguez, Director of Public Works/Facilities, Douglas Benash, City Engineer, and Veronica Sanchez.

Secretary were also present.

INVOCATION: Mr. Iniquez led the invocation.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: Commissioner Barrera led the pledge of allegiance.

PUBLIC AGENDA AND NON-

AGENDA ITEMS: No comments were received.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF SEPTEMBER 5, 2023:

Commissioner Barrera made the motion to approve and Commissioner Alvarado seconded the motion. AYES: Alvarado. Barrera, and Heredia.

TRAFFIC SAFETY ANALYSIS REQUEST FOR RED CURB PARKING RESTRICTIONS FRONTING 6872 GAGE AVENUE:

Mr. Iniguez briefly summarized. The department received a request for installation of red curb parking restrictions fronting 6872 Gage Avenue due to traffic safety concerns. The recommendation to the Traffic and Safety Commission is to approve for City Council consideration the installation of 11 feet of additional red curb parking restrictions to improve sight distance conditions.

Mr. Benash provided the full report. In response to the request from a resident for the installation of additional red curb at 6872 Gage Avenue and in accordance with City policy, a field review was conducted. The current striping on Gage Avenue and within 100 feet east and west of the property is double-double yellow painted median island.

Per California Vehicle Code a vehicle cannot cross a doubledouble yellow. Therefore, turning movements into and out of the property at 6872 Gage and the adjacent property are right turn only since a left turn is not allowed. The same situation exists for other multi-family properties west of Chalet Drive. 6872 and 6868 Gage Avenue are multi-family properties with multiple structures with some on-site parking. On both parcels, eastbound Gage Avenue currently has on-street parking spaces available with some red curb parking restrictions. In their request, the resident indicated that a large truck parks in front of 6872 Gage Avenue and does not move for several days making it difficult to exit the driveway due to limited sight distance. The California Vehicle Code states vehicles cannot park for more than 72 hours, which is a parking enforcement issue. Additionally, the Chalet Drive traffic signal creates a break to allow access out of the property. Sight distance issues are considered part of the California Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) guidelines and warrants when looking at intersections. There is no accident history at this location. The community has an overall parking shortage, which was taken into consideration when reviewing this specific case. After reviewing the field conditions, it was recommended to approve the additional 11 feet of red curb parking restrictions fronting 6872 Gage Avenue immediately west of the driveway, leaving 15 feet of unpainted curb to allow for one on-street parking space for a compact car.

Chair Heredia confirmed if the request is for the residents making right turns in and out of the property. Mr. Benash confirmed it was, adding that when a large vehicle is parked there the view is obstructed.

Commissioner Barrera made the motion to approve staff's recommendation and Commissioner Gavilanes seconded the motion. AYES: Alvarado, Barrera, Gavilanes and Heredia

TRAFFIC SAFETY ANALYSIS REQUEST FOR SPEED HUMPS ON LIVE OAK STREET FROM EMIL AVENUE TO SCOUT AVENUE:

Mr. Iniguez briefly summarized. The department received a signed petition from residents for the installation of speed humps on Live Oak Street from Emil Avenue to Scout Avenue in accordance with City Policy. Staff's

recommendation to the Commission was to authorize staff to distribute a Speed Hump Survey Questionnaire to all residents fronting Live Oak Street from Emil Avenue to Scout Avenue, requesting their confirmation of support or opposition of the installation; and if at least 51% resident support is obtained, approve for City Council consideration the installation of the 3 proposed speed humps on Live Oak Street; or if less than 51% resident support is obtained, then deny and close out the citizen speed hump request.

Mr. Benash provided the full report. The department received a signed petition from residents on Live Oak Street from Emil Avenue to Scout Avenue for the installation of speed humps. In accordance with the Speed Hump Policy, each speed hump request is reviewed on a case-by-case basis. The policy summarizes some key points during the evaluation process by the City Traffic Engineer, including: 1) the street must be a local residential street with one traveling lane in each direction, 2) the roadway width is no more than 40 feet, 3) there are no curves that would make it difficult to see, 4) traffic volumes are between 500 to 3,500 vehicles daily, 5) the speed limit is 25 miles per hour, 6) the actual measured 85th percentile speed is greater than 25 mph by 8 mph or more, 7) the street is not a transit route, and 8) the citizen support of the residents is at least 51%.

In response to the request, traffic volume counts and speed profiles were ordered. Live Oak Street is an east-west local street with one lane of travel in each direction and a posted 25 mph speed limit. The roadway width is approximately 36 feet and the length of Live Oak Street from Emil Avenue to Scout Avenue is approximately 1,230 feet. The results of the ordered counts and profiling during the 4-day period from August 3rd to August 6th indicated that the 85th percentile speed is 33.5 mph and with an average of 624 vehicles per day. After reviewing the criteria and collecting the data, the next step is the consideration of the citizens' support, which would include distribution of the Speed Hump Survey Questionnaire to all residents fronting Live Oak Street.

Chair Heredia commented that this could potentially aide in the visibility when turning onto Live Oak Street as vehicles would have to slow down. Commissioner Gavilanes made the motion to approve staff's recommendation and Commissioner Barrera seconded the motion. AYES: Alvarado, Barrera, Gavilanes and Heredia.

COMMENTS FROM STAFF:	Mr. Iniguez advised the Commission that staff received the report from CalWalks on September 18 th and is currently being reviewed.
COMMISSIONER COMMENTS:	Commissioner Alvarado was happy to see the progress being made at Ford Park. Commissioner Gavilanes was happy to see everyone and is looking forward to the holidays being underway.
ADJOURNMENT:	Chair Heredia adjourned the meeting at 5:50 p.m. to the nex scheduled meeting of November 7, 2023.

IRA AVENUE FROM CLARA STREET TO GOTHAM STREET

DATE: November 7, 2023

RECOMMENDATION:

It is staff's recommendation that the Traffic and Safety Commission by motion:

- Authorize staff to distribute a Speed Hump Survey Questionnaire to all residents fronting Ira Avenue from Clara Street to Gotham Street, requesting their confirmation of support or opposition of the proposed speed hump installation; and
- 2. If at least 51% resident support is obtained, approve for City Council consideration the installation of two (2) proposed speed humps on Ira Avenue as shown in Exhibit 2; or
- 3. If less than 51% resident support is obtained, deny and close out the citizen speed hump request.

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION:

The Public Works Department received a signed Speed Hump Petition from residents requesting the installation of speed humps on Ira Avenue from Clara Street to Gotham Street in accordance with the City's Policy for the Installation/Removal of Speed Humps ("Speed Hump Policy"). The residents expressed concerns regarding speeding activity on this street segment. Exhibit 1 shows an aerial photo of the subject street block.

ANALYSIS OF REQUEST

In accordance with the Speed Hump Policy, each speed hump request is reviewed on a case-by-case basis and submitted to the Traffic and Safety Commission for review and consideration.

The following information summarizes some of the key points reviewed during the speed hump evaluation process by the City Engineer and/or City Traffic Engineer:

- Local, residential street with one lane of travel in each direction.
- Roadway width is not more than 40 feet.
- There are no curves that would make it difficult for drivers to see the speed humps.
- Traffic volumes are between 500 and 3,500 vehicles per day.
- Posted speed limit/Prima facia speed limit of 25 miles per hour (MPH).
- Actual measured 85th percentile speeds greater than 25 MPH by 8 MPH or more.
- Speed humps shall not be installed on roadways with grades over 6 percent.
- Street is not a transit route or primary emergency response route.
- Citizen Support: Prior to the installation of speed humps, at least fifty-one (51%) percent of residents residing along the affected street should support the request (one vote per each legal address).

In response to the request, the City Engineer ordered traffic volume counts and a speed profile for Ira Avenue from Clara Street to Gotham Street. The purpose was to confirm the extent of reported speeding activity on Ira Avenue and review the traffic volume data needed to determine if the local street meets the City's speed hump policy requirements.

Ira Avenue is a north-south local residential street providing one lane of travel in each direction with a posted speed limit of 25 MPH. This block has single family and multi-family homes on both sides of the street. The roadway width is approximately 26 feet wide from curb to curb. Parking is allowed on the east side of the street. The approximate length of Ira Avenue from Clara Street to Gotham Street is approximately 800 feet. Ira Avenue is 'stop' controlled at Clara Street.

The results of the average daily traffic volume counts over a four-day period show that Ira Avenue carries an average of 2,839 vehicles per day. The traffic volumes were recorded from July 20, 2023, to July 23, 2023. If the 85th percentile speed exceeds the posted speed limit by 8 MPH, this would indicate speeding activity. The recorded speed profile measurements for the combined directions of eastbound and westbound Ira Avenue indicate the 85th percentile speed is 35 MPH, which exceeds the posted speed limit by 10 MPH; therefore, it meets the City's speed hump policy speed criteria.

CONCLUSION:

After reviewing the Speed Hump Policy criteria and the collected traffic-related data, the City Engineer has determined the subject block of Ira Avenue meets the requirements to proceed with the next step in the consideration of the citizen speed hump request; which would

include distribution of the Speed Hump Survey Questionnaire to all residents fronting Ira Avenue from Clara Street to Gotham Street.

FISCAL IMPACT:

If the necessary resident support is received based on the results of the Speed Hump Survey Questionnaire, and the City Council subsequently approves the request, the estimated cost for the installation of speed humps, signage, and pavement markings is approximately \$2,530, which is available in the current Street Maintenance Budget.
