5. AUTHORIZE AQMD FUNDS TO PURCHASE REPLACEMENT VEHICLE FOR RECREATION AND COMMUNITY SERVICES DEPARTMENT

The current vehicle utilized by the Recreation and Community Services Department is a used 1992 Ford Tempo for general transportation, which is now in poor condition due to its old age. The Recreation and Community Services Department requests City Council approval to utilize AQMD funds to purchase a 2017 Ford C-Max Energi SE plug-in hybrid.

Recommendation:

It is staff's recommendation that the City Council adopt the attached resolution authorizing the City of Bell Gardens to purchase a new 2017 Ford C-Max Energi SE vehicle from Ford of Montebello for the Recreation and Community Services Department, utilizing AQMD funding.

6. PROPOSITION 64 STUDY SESSION

City staff will be providing the City Council a study session regarding recently enacted state laws under Proposition 64 legalizing and regulating recreational marijuana within the State of California and locally within the City. City staff will discuss the City's options relating to recreational marijuana within the City and request direction. The City Council will not be taking any final action regarding recreational marijuana at the October 9th meeting.

7. PARTNERSHIP WITH CENTRAL BASIN MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT FOR THE GATEWAY CITIES REGIONAL RECYCLED WATER SYSTEM EXPANSION PROJECT GRANT APPLICATION

Central Basin Municipal Water District (District) is applying for funding assistance from the State Water Resources Control Board for their Gateway Cities Regional Recycled Water System Expansion Project. This project will extend the existing recycled water system into three cities: The City of Bell Gardens, the City of South Gate, and the City of Lynwood. In order to move forward with the project application, the District is required to obtain a formal acknowledgement of participation from their partners in the project, including the City of Bell Gardens.

Recommendation:

It is staff's recommendation that the City Council by motion adopt the attached Resolution authorizing a partnership with Central Basin Municipal Water District for the Gateway Cities Regional Recycled Water System Expansion Project funding application to the State Water Resources Control Board.

8. APPROVING 2017/2018 BUDGET AMENDMENT FOR SENATE BILL 1 ROAD MAINTENANCE REHABILITATION ACCOUNTABILITY ACT

Senate Bill (SB) 1 (Beall, Chapter 5, Statures of 2017) which is known as the Road Maintenance and Repair Accountability Act (RMRA) was signed in April of 2017 with the purpose to address road maintenance rehabilitation and critical safety needs for state highway, local streets and road systems. During the months of December 2017 and January 2018 the State shall apportion RMRA funds to eligible cities and counties. In order for the City to receive said RMRA funding, City Council must adopt this budget amendment to include a list of projects.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the City Council by motion adopt the attached resolution amending the current FY2017/2018 budget to include a list of projects for Senate Bill 1 Road Maintenance Rehabilitation Accountability Act (RMRA) Funds.
