## 6. SECOND READING OF ORDINANCE NO. 949 TO ADOPT A MILITARY EQUIPMENT USE POLICY AS REQUIRED BY ASSEMBLY BILL 481

The proposed Ordinance No. 949 adopts a policy for Bell Gardens Police Department ("Department") in compliance with Assembly Bill 481 (Chiu) ("AB 481") to address the funding, acquisition, and use by the Department of items deemed "military equipment" by lawmakers. The policy meets the law's requirements by listing the Department's inventory of military equipment; outlining a process for the public to submit questions, concerns, and complaints in relation to the use of each type of equipment; providing for the preparation of an annual report subject to City Council review and approval; and establishing a webpage for updates and the posting of annual reports.

#### **Recommendation:**

It is staff's recommendation that the City Council by motion waive the full reading and adopt Ordinance No. 949 approving the Military Equipment Use Policy in accordance with state law.
